- Step 3: Use Section Tally (sectiontally.rowan.edu) to check course attributes and availability.

- Waitlisting is not recommended—it does not guarantee placement in a specific course or section.
- Complete any outstanding placement tests, including First-Year Writing and Math, before your registration date. Otherwise, you may receive an error message when attempting to sign up for a Composition or Math course.
